

# **“EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL FOR CONSTRUCTION AND BUILDING SITES COURSE”**

## **A Requirement for NSTIR Construction Contracts**

As of 2000, the Nova Scotia Department of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal (NSTIR) has required contractors to have a Foreman/Supervisor who has attended this course present on-site on all highway construction jobs requiring earthwork. In 2005, a general contractor's Project Superintendent and the excavating contractor's on-site Foreman/Supervisor for all government building construction sites were required to have the same training. As of 2008, all RIM Tenders involving excavation work (ditching, culvert installation, etc.) require a person on site who has received this training.

NSTIR also encourages contractors to promote course attendance for non-supervisory staff to help ensure the protection of the construction site and adjacent properties and water bodies.

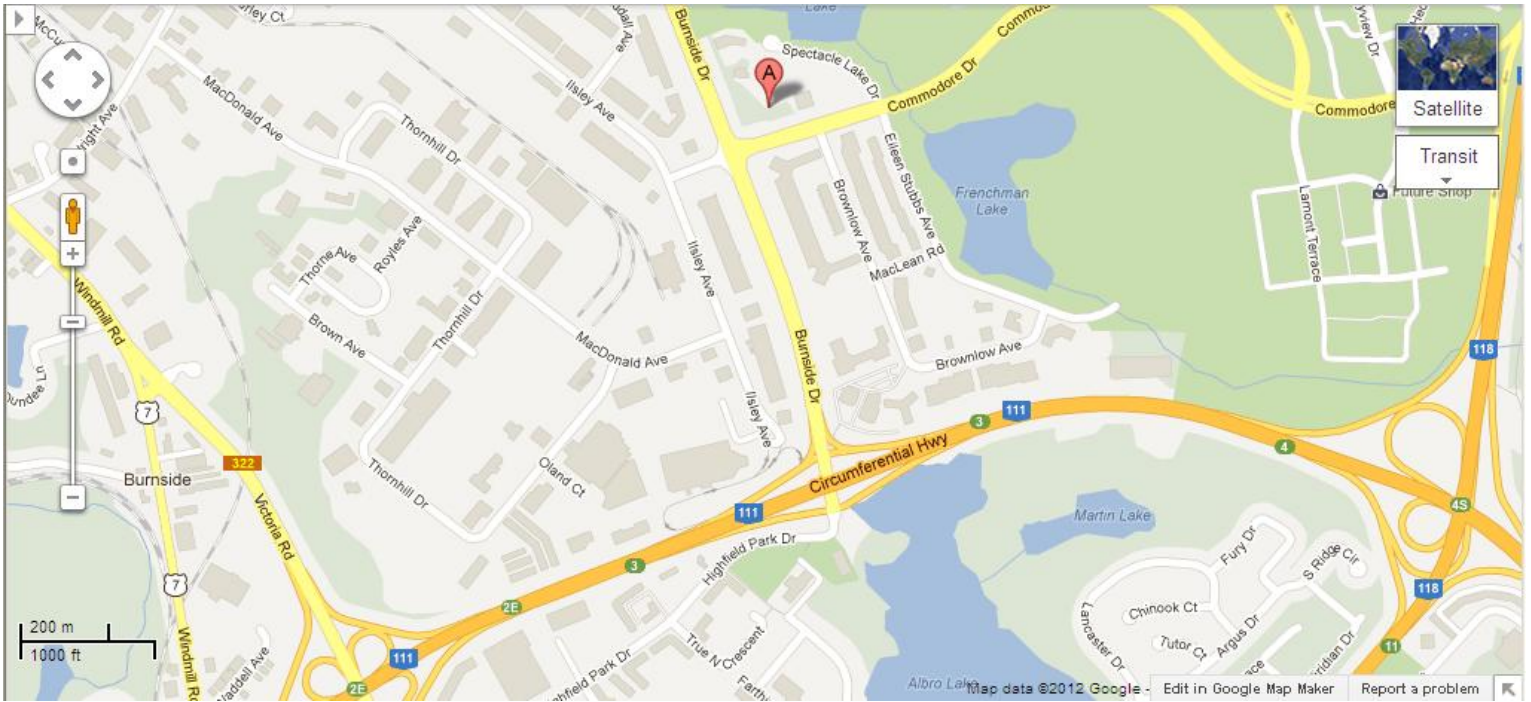
**REGISTRATION INFORMATION**
